

# GROWTH GROUP HOMEWORK | SESSION 1

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## SESSION FOCUS | PURPOSE

**VERSE** | John 10:10\*

**CONTEXT** | John 10:1–21

**PRAYER** | God, in what ways do you hope I experience more life?

\*Be prepared to quote the first memory verse. You will be called on to recite these verses, including the references. Spend time between each session meditating on the verse, reading the context for the verse, and praying the session focus prayer.

## CONTENT: VIDEO | WILD LIFE

- Go to [bit.ly/WCMenHW2](https://bit.ly/WCMenHW2) to watch the first two *Wild Life* videos:
  - The Question
  - The Wound
- Type up a net-out answering these questions about these videos:
  - What stood out to you from *The Question* video?
  - What challenged you from *The Question* video?
  - Which question sounds like yours: *Am I doing it right? Do I have what it takes? Why don't I feel alive?* What answer have you heard, good or bad, in your life?
  - Where do you naturally look to “answer” your question: work, hobbies, family, money, substances, things, women?
  - What stood out to you from *The Wound* video?
  - What challenged you from *The Wound* video?
  - Could you identify with any of the wounds the guys shared? How?
  - What do you think is your greatest wound? How has it shaped you?

Bring one printed copy of your answers to the next session.

## BEGIN ONE-ON-ONES

- Each month you'll have a one-on-one with another member of the group so you can engage on a more personal level. The goal is for the men in your group to become united by a common set of experiences, learning, and goals.
- Your mentor (or assigned apprentice to build out the meeting schedule) will match you with another person in the group. Before the next session, you will be responsible for connecting with him for breakfast, lunch, or coffee to get to know each other a little better.
- In these one-on-ones, have a posture of curiosity. Ask questions.
- Get to know each other on a deeper level and help each other process things that might have come up during the group.
- Challenge each other in love.
- Leverage these relationships to ask honest questions that can help you learn more about yourself by getting feedback on how you are perceived in the group and how someone else thinks you could grow.
